Curriculum:

The RSC, Ms. Price, developed her own curriculum for the Computer Basics course. Please see attached for the curriculum. The existing computers now run on a Windows 7 operating system, which makes teaching computer classes and running more sophisticated software based learning programs difficult because of reduced processing speed and frequent system crashes. The project will more than double the number of computers and printers and will significantly increase the operating speed while reducing system failures. Using new Microsoft Office software, Ms. Price will be able to teach an updated Computer Basics Workshop with greater effectiveness and increased capacity.
